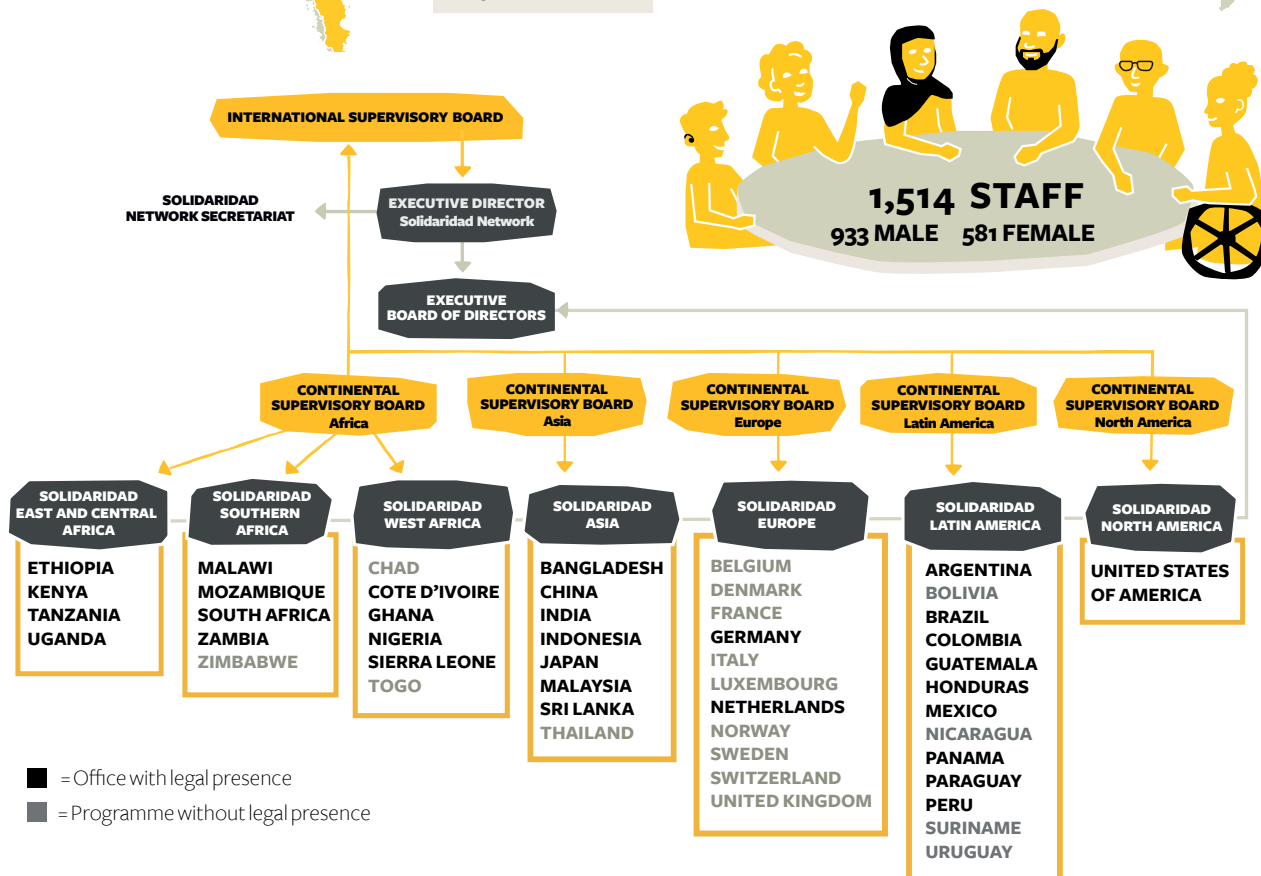
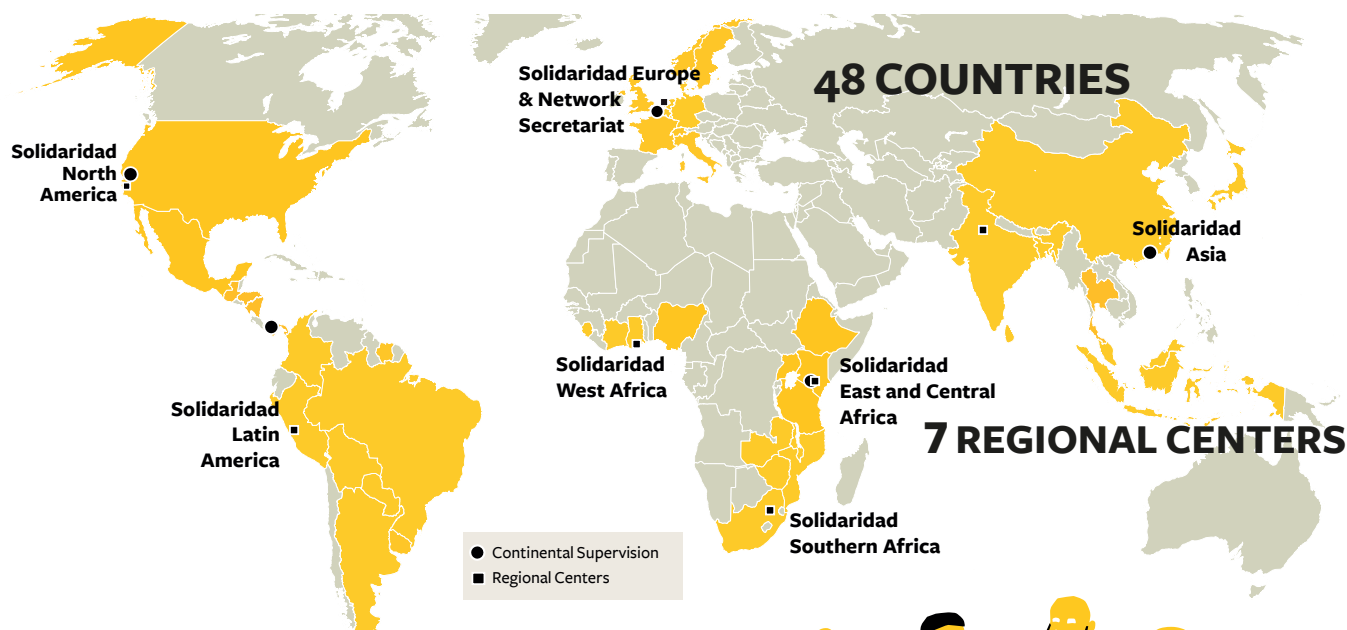

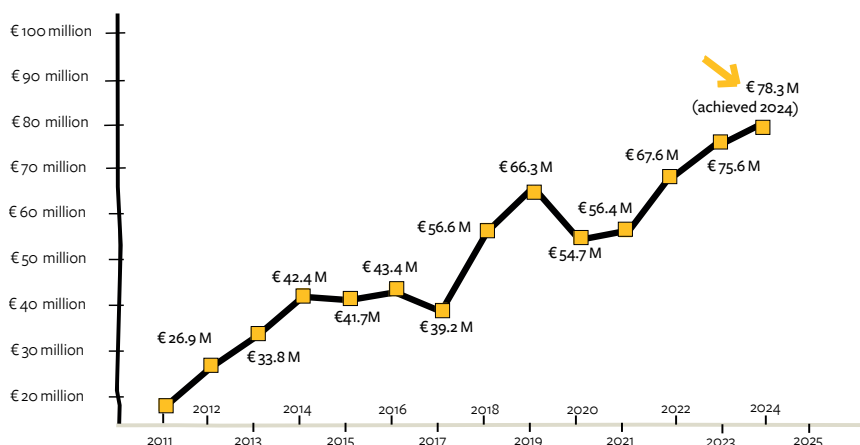

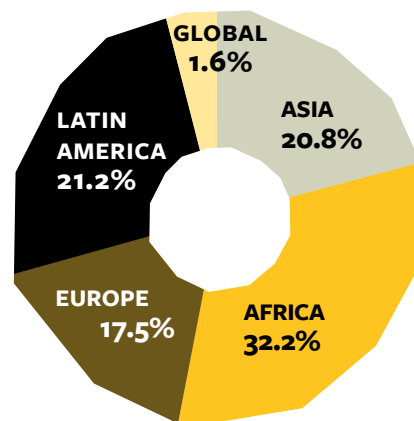

CHANGE THAT MATTERS

A FEW HIGHLIGHTS



EAST AFRICA

In Ethiopia, 591 hectares were brought under climate-smart practices. 71% of the farmers we worked with achieved self-sufficiency and surplus production and were no longer reliant on government food assistance.



LATIN AMERICA

Asómbate is an initiative that promotes climate-resilient coffee and cocoa. In Nicaragua, 2,283 farmers received USD 666,000 for the sale of 31,515 carbon removal units as a result of their contribution to environmental sustainability.

An umbrella body comprising 340,000 cocoa farmers from 75 unions in Ghana was formed to enhance farmers' representation in decision-making on prices, government interventions, land rights, and living income.



WEST AFRICA

In Bangladesh, farmers earned 15% over market prices through direct procurement of 105,000 MT soybeans. In India, 20,000 farmers joined Madhya Pradesh's democratically-led producer organization networks leading to better prices for farmers.



ASIA



SOUTHERN AFRICA

In Mozambique and Zambia, cotton farmers embraced biochar technology, leading to yield increases of up to 71%, while also improving soil health and water retention in drought-prone regions.



EUROPE

In May 2024, the European Council gave its final approval for a Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive. We advocated for a small-holder inclusive approach in the formulation and implementation of this landmark legislation.

High profile speaking engagements at OECD and Climate Week New York enhanced Solidaridad's visibility and reputation as an innovator and leader in the complex arena of first mile of supply chain sustainability and climate solutions.



NORTH AMERICA

We enhanced food security and improved productivity with 8,218 vegetable and food crop producers in Ghana, Nigeria and Sierra Leone. In Nigeria, yields increased by 70 to 135 percent.



WEST AFRICA



ASIA

By adopting green tech in the leather industry in India, 948 billion litres of water were saved - equivalent to 380,000 olympic swimming pools. Circular economy interventions have led to a reduction of 1,181 tCO₂-eq annually and a 41% drop in untreated effluent discharge.



LATIN AMERICA

In Brazil, 864 sugarcane farmers have adopted good practices on their farms, representing more than 341,000 hectares of sustainable production.
